## **Dealing with the Unrepentant**

Romans 12:19 (HCSB) Friends, do not avenge yourselves; instead, leave room for His wrath. For it is written: Vengeance belongs to Me; I will repay, says the Lord.

When someone is unrepentant sinning against you...

- 1) Repay no one evil for evil (16-18)
  - A) This wisdom ties into Jesus' Sermon on the Mount where Christ teaches: "But I tell you, don't resist an evildoer. On the contrary, if anyone slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also." Matthew 5:39 (HCSB)
  - B) Repaying evil for evil will always lead to an escalation of the problem and never a true solution.
- 2) Resolve not to take revenge (19a)
  - A) You must do what you can to bring peace, as far as it depends upon you.
  - B) Live peaceably with all.
- 3) Rest in God's Justice (19b)
  - A) Leave it to the wrath of God.
  - B) Let God repay.
- 4) Respond in Love (20-21)
  - A) Offer the offender kindness.
  - B) Overcome evil with good.

- 2. With whom does God want us to live at peace? (12:18)
- 3. What does God require of us to bring about peace in a bad situation?
- 4. Why should we not take revenge? (12:19)
- 5. How will the wrath of God be dealt out to unrepentant offenders?
- 6. What is the purpose of showing kindness to an enemy? (12:20)
- 7. Why is it wrong to repay evil with evil?
- 8. How does doing good to an enemy overcome evil?
- 9. Whom do you need to love and bless this week even though he or she hurts you?
