Surrendering your finances to Jesus will cause you to...

1) Repent of your _____ (7-9)

A)God is plainly declaring that the tithe belongs to him. If the tithe belongs to him, and we use it for ourselves, what else can it be called except robbery?

2) Restore a Commitment to Tithe _____ (10)

A) "Storehouse": A room in the temple to store the tithes of crops and animals brought by the people (cf. 2 Chr. 31:11; Neh. 10:38,39; 12:44; 13:12). This was the temple treasury.

B)In Malachi's time, tithes were used...

1. To fund the theocracy by sustaining the Levites (cf. Lev. 27:30–33; Num. 18:8–28; Deut. 12:18; Neh. 13:10)

2. To fund the natural religious festivals (Deut. 12:6–17; 14:22–27)

3. To care for the poor (Deut. 14:28, 29)

3) Receive God's Promised _____ (10-12)

A)God will pour down blessings, rebuke the devourer, and make your situation a delight. There will be no more need!

Application Questions

2. What does God's plea for his people to return to him tell you about him? What does this mean to you?

4. How would this passage help you to deal with a relatively wealthy fellow Christian believer who struggles to maintain a disciplined attitude to finance and who expresses the view that he or she does not consider systematic and regular giving to the church to be a requirement under New Testament teaching?

11. When have you clearly sensed that your fellowship with God was disrupted because of your sin?

12. In what ways do we try to rationalize our sins?

13. How have you been guilty of robbing God?
