Where is Jesus in Judges 3?

- 1. The promise God gave Abraham of a descendant who would bless the whole earth (Genesis 12:1-3) was in peril in Judges
- 3:14. Had the Moabites overpowered and annihilated the Israelites the promised messiah, Jesus, would not have come.
- 2. Ehud is a "type" of Christ who delivers God's people from bondage and slavery. Jesus brings true freedom to all who trust in Him.
- 3. Through the weakness of Ehud, God brought salvation to Israel. Through the weakness of the death of Jesus on a cross, God has brought salvation to us.
