Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's message. Use them for personal or family devotions to further dig into God's word.

- 1) What are some of the privileges and responsibilities of kings?
- 2) Give examples of how Jesus has those same rights and responsibilities in the kingdom of God. For example, Jesus has a throne (Isa. 66:1) and a crown (Rev. 14:14).
- 3) Jesus came into the world to establish God's kingdom. Read Matthew 18:3-4, 19:14, John 18:36, and Romans 14:17. From these passages, what can you tell about the nature of God's kingdom?
- 4) How were Jesus' miracles related to the kingdom of God? See Matthew 12:28 to guide your thinking.
- 5) Read Matthew 10:34-39. What is the purpose of God's kingdom?
- 6) In what specific ways are the purposes of God's kingdom being fulfilled today?
- 7) What are some practical ways that you can show that Christ is your king?
- 8) In Matthew 5:27-30 and 43-48, Jesus explains how the ethics of the kingdom of heaven differ from the Law of Moses. Summarize what he says in your own words.
- 9) If Jesus brought in the Kingdom of God, why do we need to pray for God's kingdom to come?
- 10) The kingdom of God is most simply defined as the rule of God. With that in mind, what does it mean to pray for God's kingdom to come into the world?
- 11) What evidence is there of God's increasing rule over all aspects of your life? In what areas are you reluctant to give him control?
