What did the prophet do in anticipation of God's response? (2:1)

What did God tell Habakkuk to do? (2:2)

What does it mean in verse 3 that "the vision will certainly come?"

Habakkuk 2:4b says, "The righteous one will live by his faith." What does this mean?

Who is being described in verses 6-20? The Babylonians? The Israelites? Us?

Habakkuk asked God why he would use the Chaldeans to punish people more righteous than they. Chapter 2 is God's response. Summarize God's answer in your own words.

To whom were the "woes" addressed? (2:6, 9, 12, 15, 19)

What kind of people are described in verses 6-8? What kind of people are described in verses 9-11? What kind of people are described in verses 12-14? What kind of people are described in verses 15-17? What kind of people are described in verses 18-20?

What lessons can we learn about God in this chapter?

What do we learn about justice (remember verse 4)?

What applications can we make to our lives today?

Have you ever seen people "get a taste of their own medicine" or "fall into their own traps"? How did that make you feel? Did you ever take it as a warning for yourself?

What idols do people worship today? In what ways are they powerless and foolish compared to God?

What sins of this nation are deplorable to you?

What "woes" might Habakkuk pronounce on our culture today?
