#### Jesus Makes all Things New

Text: Mark 2:18-22

# Context -

In Mark 2-3, Jesus is in the process of answering 5 clarifying questions that are asked by the religious authorities. Question 1 was, "Who can forgive sins but God alone?" (Mark 2:1-12); Question 2 was, "Why does He eat with tax collectors and sinners?" (Mark 2:13-17). The question before us in our current text is, "Why do John's disciples and the Pharisee's disciples fast, but your disciples do not fast?"

## Since Jesus makes all things new...

## 1. \_\_\_\_\_ the joy His presence brings (vs. 18-20)

- A. The disciples were not to mourn and fast since Jesus was with them. His presence with them was a cause for celebration.
- B. Fasting would come when Jesus would go to the cross. Reflection on Christ's payment for our sins on the cross is a just cause for present fasting.
- C. Have you personally experience the joy of the presence of Christ in your life? Have you personally used fasting to fight against sin in your life?

#### 2. \_\_\_\_\_ how He fulfilled the Old Covenant (vs. 21-22)

- A. Jesus taught the Pharisees that He was doing something new (inaugurating a new covenant) which does not abolish the Old Covenant but fulfills it.
- B. God does not want us to "add" him to our already busy and established lives, rather He seeks to completely "transform" us and make us completely new.
- C. Have you personally experienced the complete transformation and renewal of Jesus Christ?
