## **Jesus and the Parable of the Sower**

Text: Mark 4:1-20

**Context -** As Jesus' ministry continues to grow and experience resistance, He shares a parable about receptivity to the Gospel.

Main Idea - True disciples of Christ hear, respond to, and share the Gospel.

## As Jesus teaches... 1. \_\_\_\_\_ to the parable of the sower (vs. 1-9) A. Jesus opens the parable with the word, "Listen" (vs. 3) and then closes it with, "Anyone who has ears to hear should listen." (vs. 9) B. Having ears to hear involves surrender of proud self-reliance and submission to God (cf. Isa. 6:10; 43:8; 44:18). (ESV Study Bible) 2. \_\_\_\_\_ the purpose of parables (vs. 10-11) A. It has been said that parables are "earthly stories with a heavenly meaning." Parables are simply stories that teach us about the kingdom of God. B. While believers will hear and obey the parables, unbelievers will never receive and apply them. (vs. 11) 3. \_\_\_\_\_ the Word of God produce fruit in you (vs. 12-20) A. Jesus himself gives a clear explanation of this parable. It is the true believer that will hear the word, welcome it, and bear fruit. B. Are you yielding to the fruit producing Word of God?
