Context - After Jesus sending out the 12, Mark inserts a story about the death of John the Baptist. Throughout chapter 6, Mark is encouraging the early church readers to endure suffering and persecution.

Main Idea - By the Grace of God, stay faithful to the end.

The example of John the Baptist teaches us to	
1.	God and not man (vs. 14-17)
A.	John had no concern for the power and status of Herod Antipas, he clearly honored God more than man.
B.	The fear of man is an idol, a snare, and a distraction. It paralyzes the Christian's obedience to Jesus.
2.	on genuine holiness (vs. 18-21)
Α.	John is described as a "righteous and holy man." His walk with God had both a disturbing and a captivating effect on Herod.
B.	Jerry Bridges defines holiness as "nothing less than conformity to the character of God." It is to pursue a life "without sin."
3. .	the realities of a broken world (vs. 22-29)
A.	John the Baptist was a good and righteous man who followed God and was faithful in his ministry. Yet, he spent two years in prison and was
