Text: Mark 6:30-44

Context - After sending out the 12 to minister and sharing the story of the death of John the Baptist, Mark now writes about the return of the 12. Mark wrote during a time of Christian persecution and poverty.

Main Idea - God will provide.

To experience God's provisions	
1	remote time with Jesus (vs. 30-34)
A.	The disciples needed some rest and alone time with Jesus after their first time out ministering.
B.	The greater the demands in your life, the greater your need to spend time alone with Jesus.
2.	what you have to Christ (vs. 35-38)
A.	Jesus commanded the disciples to feed the crowds, and they struggled with the resources. They finally surrendered all that they could find - five loaves of bread and two fishes.
B.	Are you giving Jesus all that you have?
3.	Jesus Deity (37-44)
A.	Jesus takes five loaves of bread and two fish and feeds more than 15,000
