Text: Mark 6:30-44

Context - After sending out the 12 to minister and sharing the story of the death of John the Baptist, Mark now writes about the return of the 12. Mark wrote during a time of Christian persecution and poverty.

Main Idea - God will provide.

To experience God's provisions...

1. _____ remote time with Jesus (vs. 30-34)

- A. The disciples needed some rest and alone time with Jesus after their first time out ministering.
- B. The greater the demands in your life, the greater your need to spend time alone with Jesus.

2. _____ what you have to Christ (vs. 35-38)

- A. Jesus commanded the disciples to feed the crowds, and they struggled with the resources. They finally surrendered all that they could find - five loaves of bread and two fishes.
- B. Are you giving Jesus all that you have?

3. _____ Jesus Deity (37-44)

- A. Jesus takes five loaves of bread and two fish and feeds more than 15,000 people with 12 baskets of food left over. This is a miracle that only God could do.
- B. Have you seen the deity of Christ and understood that with God all things are possible?
