## **Behold Your King**

**Text:** Mark 11:1-11

**Context -** After a journey through the teaching and miracles of Jesus in Mark 1-10, in chapter 11 Mark now brings us to Jerusalem and begins the Holy Week. This week will end with Jesus death on the cross.

Main Idea - Jesus is the King of Kings!

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- 1. \_\_\_\_\_ His sovereign deity (vs. 1-7)
- A. The way the detailed events of this passage unfold remind us that Jesus is God and that He is in control of all things: Eph. 1:11; Isa. 46:10-11.
- B. No other king who has ever lived can claim the power and authority that Jesus displayed.
- 2. \_\_\_\_\_ His humility (vs. 7-9)
- A. Jesus is fulfilling Zechariah 9:9, a prophecy says that the Messiah will be "lowly". What we observe here is a humble Man on the back of a humble beast, making a humble declaration of His identity.
- B. God took on human flesh and humbled himself. Philippians 2:8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
- 3. \_\_\_\_\_ his Salvation (vs. 10-11)
- A. The word "Hosanna" is was originally a Hebrew prayer that means "Save us now." The crowd was chanting it as a recognition of Jesus as the political messiah in the lineage of King David.
- B. Jesus was not the political savior they believed him to be. He came the first time to die for our sins, and he will come a second time to reign. All Christians are commanded to spread his message of salvation to the entire world.
