# Living as Sojourners

Text: Genesis 21:22-34

**Context -** Following the birth of Isaac and Hagar's exile, Abraham now settles within the boundaries of the promised land and meets with Abimelech, the king of Gerar.

Gerar.
As You Sojourn
I God's Peace (vs. 22-24)
<b>A.</b> After suffering the household barrenness from Abraham's previous lie (Genesis
20), Abimelech wants to live in peace with Abraham. Abraham agrees to the terms
of peace and accepts the treaty.
<b>B.</b> Abraham was doing what all believers should do: pursuing peace with his unbe-
lieving neighbors without compromising kingdom principles.
II God's Provisions (vs. 25-32)
<b>A.</b> In that desert land, a well was essential for survival, both for a man's flocks and
for his family. Through this treaty, God was faithfully providing for Abraham's basic
physical needs.
<b>B.</b> God also promises to take care of our basic physical needs so that we need not
worry. (See Matthew 6:25-34)
III God Publicly (vs. 33-34)

**A.** This Tamarisk tree functioned as a reminder of the treaty concluded between two well known contemporaries, and also as a marker of one of Abraham's worship sites.

**B.** How well do you set apart places in your life where you worship God? Do others know that you are a worshiper of God?
